#### 2014 Accomplishments

- 3. Financial Update David Deere
- 100% of fees collected
- Gst refund from previous years of \$20,734 by being declared a municipality
- Flood relief \$56,116 refund from insurance (initial claim) or government (remaining)
- 4. Operational update Ron Lutz

**Pump House and Plant Improvements** 

- A. Scada system put in for \$15,000
- Call out notification
- Required by Alberta Environment
- Monitors turbidity and chlorine
- Will reduce the risk of plant shutdown and need to haul water
- B. New submersible pump
- Pump put in the river for \$2,000

### 2013 Flood

- River diversion need to correct this summer (estimate \$10,000)
- Gallery repairs \$41,000
- Divers cleaned out the tanks for \$15,000
- Total Cost applied for is \$56,000 will be covered by Alberta Government and Insurance

## 5. Financial Report - David Deere

#### Discussion on the equity share

- All community members share in the value of the asset
- In the 80s, each share was \$2500
- Present value \$11,800
- No evaluation since 1993
- Each individual equity share is \$25,000 \$30,000 (estimated)
- Doing a replacement value evaluation this year
- There is an impact on the reserve
- 5% of the replacement value has to be in the reserve
- Reserves have to be topped up, reserves were used to fix the leaks; board will build a plan on how to replenish the reserve
- Insurance costs will also likely go up
- License to operate is good until 2019, upon renewal we may need some changes
- Water license is good in perpetuity

#### 11. General discussion

- Question about the water meters
- It is still planned to assess it
- Question about Rocky View County's progress on water / wastewater
- Discussion about the potential to add extra customers to the WWU now that the leak has been repaired
- Update from RCR, they have engaged Urban systems (planning engineering) to develop the ski hill; starting next week the community will start to be engaged.
- Question about the quality of the system.
- Weaknesses have been fixed, distribution lines are fixed as needed. Raw line has been assessed as part of the leak repair. Wintergreen woods is 14 years old.
- It is known that some curb stops aren't working, we don't plan to fix them
- Everyone should have an operating valve in their house
- We don't want to test the curb stops and break them in the process
- We don't want to spend money to fix each curb stop \$5k per
- Tanks are cleaned out, new 10 hp pump, leak has been repaired, new scada system
- Big costs coming would be a UV filter for the plant, new distribution main up at the plant will eventually have to be repaired (we are prepared with everything but not the new pumps)
- Lots of good news, very robust system
- Plant is running very well, mud was pumped up during the flood and clean water came out
- By regulation we have to test both up at the plant and at a household; never had a failure
- Right now the system is the best it has ever been
- Question about the due date for the fees, previously it was July 15<sup>th</sup>, now it appears to be June 1<sup>st</sup> (David Deere will review)
